1. define a clear goal and global context for the project, based on personal interests
2. identify prior learning and subject-specific knowledge relevant to the project
3. demonstrate research skills.

Criterion A: Investigating

Please **delete** the questions before submitting your report.

Part One: Explain and justify your topic of interest. Why have you chosen to do this for your Personal Project? What do you hope to gain from it? What do you want to learn? What is the history of your personal interest in this topic?

Part Two: Use a Global Context (GC) to FOCUS your topic. Explain how your choice of Global Context has helped you focus in on a certain element of your topic of interest. Why does this Global Context work best? You could say how a different Context might have informed your project differently, and what limitations your chosen context places on you.

Part Three: What is your goal going to be? (ONE SENTENCE! Make it SMART!). How has your GC helped you narrow down your goal? How is it going to be HIGHLY challenging for you? Refer to at least two of the ATL (Approaches to Learning) skills and at least two of the IB Learner Profile Traits here.

Part Four: Connecting your personal project to prior learning and subject specific knowledge is ESSENTIAL! What have you covered in another MYP class about your project topic that is relevant? Think about the skills or knowledge gained from any class you have ever taken. (If you cannot think of any academic examples from school, think about your life experience outside of school - what have you learned that relates to your topic?) How has it helped you and prepared you for this project?

Part Five: 'Excellent research skills' include choosing a wide variety of relevant sources, justifying your selection of sources, and evaluating your sources using a formal evaluation tool. Write 4 sentences per source (from your PP Journal 5 Chart) answering these questions: What is the source, how did you find it, and where is it from (citation column)? What new understandings did you gain from your research (notes/summary column)? How do you know your sources are credible (give at least 2 reasons from the source credibility column)? How will this source help you complete your personal project (issues/topics covered column)?
